Background

Monterey Peninsula Water Management District Ordinance No. 197

- 14 acre feet of water allocated to Carmel-By-The-Sea
- Ordinance effective March 1, 2025
- Pure Water Monterey Expansion project
- Projected completion end of 2025
- Water allocation cannot be sold
- Cease and Desist Order (CDO) still in place
 - District applying for a modification to the order



Background

Carmel Municipal Code Chapter 17.50 - Water Management Program Requirements

- Water allocation resolution must adopted by the City Council
- Each resolution must include:
 - Quantity of water available
 - Land use categories that will receive water
 - Amount of water allocated to each category
 - Amount of water that remains in unallocated reserve
- 10 percent reserved for affordable housing
- Prioritized for coastal recreation, access, and essential public services

Commercial Category

- Concerns about placing water in this category
- Expansion of restaurants
- Other non-food commercial uses:
 - Large bathtub or additional shower head to a hotel room
 - Dog grooming
 - Dry cleaner with on-site laundry
 - Laundromat (new, or adding machines to existing)
- Carl Cherry Center request for 2 utility sinks
- Future Housing Element programs



Commercial Category

Option A:

Category #4: Commercial

This category includes construction of new commercial floor space, conversion of existing space to uses with greater demand for water and the commercial component of mixed-use projects. <u>Excluded from this category is the creation or expansion of full-line or specialty restaurants.</u>
